BWG is home to the renowned Holland Marsh, some of the most fertile land in Canada. Generations of family operations and experience, and proximity to a large domestic market are the foundations of BWG's food production sector. BWG is home to 117 agricultural businesses and industry leaders such as Maple Leaf Farms and Gwillimdale Farms.

The Holland March Growers Association (HMGA) represents the 125 farms in this unique agricultural cluster of 7,000 acres of prime agricultural land, 125 farms and a host of supporting storage, packing and processing operations. The HMGA estimates the total economic impact of the Holland March at over \$1B annually.

HMGA and its members partner with government, academic institutions and industry associations to support the growers and packers on research and special projects such as irrigation, soil health and waste reduction.

The Bradford co-op has been a vital partner to area vegetable growers and greenhouse operators providing knowledge, support and advice to area farmers for over 75 years.

Nearly 150 years has passed since the first member of the Hambly family set up their farmstead in the Holland Marsh. Over the decades, the family business has grown, diversified, thrived, adapted and innovated. Today's Gwillimdale Farms is a leading producer within BWG's agribusiness community.

This longevity and success are due to the family's continued adherence to core ethical values, superior service and a commitment to excellence in the quality of every vegetable cultivated. Every day, approximately 250,000 pounds of carrots, onitons, potatoes, beets and parsnips are processed in Gwillimdale's cleaning/packaging plant, distributed through the Ontario Food Terminal, as well as directly to large retail partners such as Longo's and Metro.

Year round, Gwillimdale employs
75 people, all of whom are trained
in the latest tools, techniques and
technologies of food production to
ensure maximum efficiency.
